

"Thought for the Week" : Fr lan

Trinity 20

"We want you to do us a favour" - that is what James & John were asking Jesus. It was a request born out of love and loyalty for Jesus. They wanted to be with him in eternity as they had been on earth, enjoying the privilege of close personal contact. They had inherited the traditional Jewish view of the royal heavenly court and that upset the other ten - James and John were trying to book the best seats!

It was an audacious request: "...do whatever we ask of you". They had heard and seen strangers coming with their requests; surely they could do the same. Surely being part of the "inner circle" gave them some advantage? The other ten must have thought this was an abuse of privilege - or were they just cross that James and John had got in first?

They had all misunderstood the true nature of Jesus' ministry: "I am among you as one who serves". That was no idle boast; Jesus was always available to all who came to him, with whatever need they had. The Pharisees with their questions, the poor, the sick, the outcasts: they were all given time and felt his love.

But the disciples had to learn: as servants of all, as doers of the Father's will, they could not call the tune or make special claims. True greatness would come only when they had given everything for the sake of others, just as their Lord did throughout his life - even to the point of surrendering that life in order to open a new way into God's presence.

There is a great paradox abort the Christian faith; we have to look at things from a totally different angle. Those who would be great have to learn that it is serving others at all times - no matter how hard, or dangerous, that may be - is the greatest privilege of all. All those who high office in government or leadership do well to remember what Jesus said!

St Gregory the Great described the Christian community as "The Servants of the servants of God" and reminded his readers that all those who seek to be saints must first of all be servants - for that is the call that goes out to all who try to follow the way of Jesus.
