"Thought for the Week" :Fr. Gordon

St Mary Magdalene

"You have turned my mourning into dancing; you have put off my sackcloth and girded me with gladness; Therefore my heart sings to you without ceasing; O Lord my God, I will give you thanks for ever." Psalm 30. 11-12

This weekend we celebrate our Patronal Festival. We are blessed to have two patron saints, St James the Apostle is one and Mary Magdalene the other.

Mary Magdalene divides opinions. Confusion began to surround her very early on.

It's clear that Mary was a woman whom Jesus had delivered from evil spirits and who came to love and follow him. She was present at the crucifixion, and as, of course, the first to find the empty tomb and meet the risen Christ on Easter morning.

Mary Magdalene crosses so many boundaries: theology, literature, gender studies, cultural history, social anthropology, psychoanalysis. She stands out in the gospels as a woman in a world of men, of course, she's not unique in this by any means.

But to some interpreters, Mary Magdalene is the archetype of the fallen woman at its most threatening to men: libidinous, teasing, seductive, and dangerous.

Mary subverts the norms, she challenges the stereotypes. And most astonishingly, Jesus seems to affirm her subversive personality; never does he criticise Mary as he did others of his inner circle.

Mary is the woman with an altogether unique role in Christian history. She loved Jesus, maybe not more than others loved him. But Mary was given a privilege to be the first witness of the resurrection and to take the news of Easter to the other disciples.

That word Witness" sounds passive doesn't it? The onlooker seeing, observing, but disengaged and not getting involved. And yet Mary Magdalene is the passionately committed witness for whom seeing, believing, acclaiming, loving, and following all merge into one great "yes" that transforms her entire life.

When Jesus calls her by name in the garden, "Mary!", she knows that she is alive again; she knows that she's ransomed, healed, restored, forgiven. "Rabboni!" She cries - and in that moment a lifetime of passion and pain, of searching and longing, of hunger, fear, and hope, is all gathered up.

It's the greatest recognition scene in human history. Mary recognizes Jesus on behalf of the whole human race; it's about giving a reason for the hope that lies within us. And the world is changed - for ever.

Feed the Hungry

The lockdown has meant that we have been unable to have food collections at St James in aid of the Gloucester Foodbank. There are collection-points in most foodstores (Quedgeley Tesco for one); I hope that you will keep this important part of our mission & ministry in your minds, especially with the school holidays now upon us.

Fr John's Notes:

This Sunday (26th July) we keep the Feast of one of our Patron Saints St James the Apostle. Sadly, we shall not be able to follow the Eucharisy with a buffet lunch, but we hope to correct that later in the year when situations improve. There will be TWO celebrations of the Eucharist:

9am Holy Eucharist (Said) 9.45am Church will be cleaned / sanitised 11am Holy Eucharist (Said)

11.45am Church will be cleaned / sanitised

Each service will take approximately 30 - 45 minutes and there will be a strict limit of **30 people** at each service.

A single service sheet will be available for use, which we shall ask you to take away afterwards and there will be some necessary changes to our usual pattern.

(e.g.: No sharing of The Peace; Communion will be given in one kind only; there will be no offertory procession - we shall indicate where you may leave your financial gifts. We shall be unable to serve coffee afterwards.)

To comply with Government "Track & tracing" requirements, we have been asked to keep a list (names only) of those attending. Social-distancing & hygiene guidelines will be in place; GREEN seating markers will be in place.

The church will remain open for private prayer on Sundays from 12noon - 4pm. (Fr John will usually be available from 10.15 - 12noon)

The Eucharist during Midweek:

The <u>10am Wednesday Eucharist</u> will return on 5th August, when we shall keep the Feast of the Transfiguration of Jesus. We shall asking the congregation to sit in the GREEN seats in the nave and sadly no coffee will be served afterwards. (The Wednesday 7.30pm Eucharist will need to wait a little longer.)
